It is my honor and privilege to announce that St. John's has completed a successful Search process and we are blessed to be welcoming The Reverend Laura Annette Bryant to be the 14^h Rector of St. John's Episcopal Church in Johnson City, TN. Rev. Bryant comes to us from Atlanta and will be moving to the beautiful mountains of Northeast Tennessee with her husband, John Hutton. John is a structural engineer and is familiar with our area having just completed work on the addition at Dobyns-Bennett High School in Kingsport, TN.

Rev. Bryant or Rev. Laura, both are fine with her, will be moving into her office beginning November 10th and will conduct services beginning November 15th.

I hope the whole congregation is excited as I am and the vestry is as well! We are so incredibly thankful for the amazing work done by our Search Committee and their leader, Dr. Tom McGinnis. We were so fortunate to have the Rev. Canon Michael Spear-Jones as our consultant and the support and expertise of the Rev. Canon Michelle Bolt and the Rt. Rev. Brian Cole.

St. John's Welcomes Our 14th Rector The Reverend Laura Annette Bryant



It is a great pleasure to announce that The Reverend Laura Annette Bryant has accepted the call to serve as the 14th Rector (and historically the first female Rector) of St. John's Episcopal Church.

A native of the Midwest – St. Louis and Chicago (A Cardinal's fan!), Reverend Bryant graduated from Duke University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in religion in 1980 and earned a Master of Divinity degree from the Candler School of Theology in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1987. Currently she is pursuing a Doctor of Ministry degree in Gospel and Culture from Columbia Theological Seminary. She was ordained to the priesthood in 1990 and

has served in a variety of positions since that time. Most recently, she served the Diocese of Atlanta in three parishes. The Reverend Bryant was founding director and priest of The Road Episcopal Service Corps, an intentional community and formation program for young adults. She also was an associate priest for the Church of the Common Ground, a worshiping community for the homeless who live on the streets of Atlanta. She has been involved in the work of the Absalom Jones Center for Racial Healing and was a member of Beloved Community: Commission for Dismantling Racism. She says: "Having served now as a priest for 30 years, and in several contexts, I can say that I love the church and the work of ministry even more now than when I first began." (con't page 2)

St. John's Welcomes Our 14th Rector The Reverend Laura Annette Bryant

The Reverend Bryant exemplifies our core values in many ways. Through our interviews with her, our time with her during her visit, and conversations with her references, we have come to appreciate the depth and quality of her ministry. It is easy to see why she was such a beloved presence at The Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Burlington, VT where she served as Interim Dean: She is a gifted liturgist and an excellent preacher; she is good at building teams; she is deeply committed to pastoral care and is extremely kind. Both contemplative and active, she is excellent in a crisis, has lots of energy, and is centered in joy. She listens deeply and works collaboratively. While remaining respectful of tradition, she tends to push a congregation to grow, and speaks the truth of the gospel. She has a special interest in the role of scripture in spiritual formation and of the imagination in the life of faith. A self-described "lifelong learner," she loves exploring – a landscape, a hiking trail, a city, or a story – and loves discovering the gifts and courage of others.

She and her husband, John Hutton, a structural engineer, have two grown sons.

One of her favorite prayers is one said over the newly baptized but applicable to all of us at all times: "Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and love you, and the gift of Joy and wonder in all your works" (BCP 308).

To the Parish Family and our New Rector:

All of the members of the Search Committee rejoice that The Reverend Laura Bryant has accepted the call to be the Rector of St. John's!

We are also grateful to all who have supported the search process since November 2018. At that time, John Nagy and the vestry worked diligently to form a search committee, and Bishop Brian Cole and Canon Michelle Bolt provided us with the information and support we needed to devote ourselves to this work. We have been especially blessed with our search consultant, The Reverend Canon Michael Spear-Jones, who has helped navigate us through the complex informational, procedural, emotional, and spiritual issues involved in this process. The church staff, including Nick Andrews, Jon Lau, Rae Grosserode, and Deacon Cathy Johnston, have been invaluable, particularly during the last phase of the process. And Canon SuzeAnne has guided all of us at St. John's through every phase of the search with grace-filled patience.

Fundamental to the entire process was the participation of the parish family, especially the Holy Conversations and the CAT survey in 2019. Perhaps the most important support has been everyone's consistent prayers during the weekly services, and the prayers that the search committee shared at each meeting. All of this has helped the "Searchers" focus on hard work and discernment. We have several people on the search committee who have been involved in previous searches for rectors at St. John's. We agree that this has been a process unlike others we have experienced, and we are grateful.

September 30, October 7, 14, 21. "Becoming Beloved Community" with Beth Wiley and Frances Jackson, 6 -7 pm. Followed by Compline with Canon SuzeAnne. On our diocesan website (http://www.dioet.org/) there is information on "Becoming Beloved Community". The Beloved Community is the body within which we promote the fruits of the spirit and grow to recognize our kinship as people who love God and love the image of God that we find in our neighbors, ourselves, and in creation. It provides a positive, theologically and biblically based ideal toward which we can grow in love, rather than framing our justice and reconciliation efforts as fundamentally "against" (as in anti-racism, antioppression, etc).

Our national website (https://www.episcopalchurch.org/) also has links to "Becoming Beloved Community". "As the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement, we dream and work to foster Beloved Communities where all people may experience dignity and abundant life and see themselves and others as beloved children of God. Together, we are growing as reconcilers, justice-makers, and healers in the name of Christ.

"The Beloved Community" was a vision of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. "The end is reconciliation; the end is redemption; the end is the creation of The Beloved Community. It is this type of spirit and this type of love that can transform opponents into friends. It is this type of understanding goodwill that will transform the deep gloom of the old age into the exuberant gladness of the new age. It is the love which will bring about miracles in the hearts of men."

Discussions will be led by Beth Wiley and Frances Jackson. Beth has been part of a seminar on "The Beloved Community" through the Diocese of Tennessee and she will share some of her resources with us. A Zoom link will be sent. All are welcome!


