- Blessing of the Animals: Our annual Blessing of the Animals in celebration of the Feast of St. Francis will be held on Sunday October 2, 3:00 pm. - Vestry Nominations: The Parish is seeking nominations for candidates to replace three current members of the Vestry whose terms will end this year. Outgoing Vestry members are Emily Bidgood, Brandon Guffey, and Ed Jordan. In accordance with our bylaws, these three, plus one continuing Vestry member, will serve as the Vestry Election Committee.

The Vestry serves an essential role in our church life, so your participation in this process is important. You can nominate yourself or someone else. (Members of St. John's who are at least 16 years of age are eligible to serve on the Vestry.) If you want to nominate another member of the Parish, it's a good idea to get his/her permission to do so. Or, if you prefer, you can pass along the name to a member of the election committee, who will check with the prospective nominee to ascertain his/her willingness to serve. Conversely, if you are asked by someone to consider serving on the Vestry, please do consider this prayerfully and don't be too quick to dismiss the idea. It's a responsibility not to be taken lightly yet also a very rewarding one.

Elections will take place in November. Watch for updates in the weekly e-newsletter (*This Week @ St. John's*) and the worship service bulletins.

It's a national organization with a uniquely practical, effective, and compassionate approach to helping homeless and low-income families achieve sustainable independence. Family Promise provides an opportunity for these families to remain together while addressing the challenges that confront them in obtaining housing. Families receive case management specific to their needs and in-depth support as they work to move ahead.

Family Promise is also unique in that it accomplishes all this through collaboration with faith congregations and community agencies. Our local affiliate, Family Promise of Greater Johnson City (FPJC), primarily serves families in Washington, Carter, Unicoi, Greene, Johnson and the eastern end of Sullivan counties in Northeast Tennessee. St. John's is one of 17 churches in this area providing support and assistance.
