I love new experiences. New adventures. New people in my life to know and love. New books. New insights.

I love our God, whose mercies are new every morning, and who says “I am about to do a new thing. Do you not perceive it (Isaiah 43:19)?” Easter celebrates the gift of new life out of death. The gospel we proclaim is Good News.

But I also love those experiences which only grow in richness and meaning with repetition and time. Friendships which deepen over decades. I love praying the same ancient prayers week after week and the profundity that emerges and continues to surprise in familiar texts.

Such was my experience this past Sunday praying together the prayer of thanksgiving at the end of the 9:00 a.m. service.

I am grateful to be traveling with you, even and especially during the trials of pandemic time. I am grateful to those who make possible our outdoor worship services (in the splendor and beauty of God’s creation!) and worship and learning via Zoom (in the splendor of technology!). I am grateful to those who have offered their gifts in new ways and to all those who keep “showing up” to pray and serve and give in whatever ways are possible.

As we slowly emerge from the pandemic, we will delight in a return to old and familiar patterns and places. But we have grown and changed, and God will do new things with us and through us, and God will call us to new adventures.

Thanks be to God for what is old and what is new.

Family Promise and Melting Pot

Family Promise is currently serving 6 families with the following number of family members, respectively: 9, 7, 6, 5, 2 and 2, a **total of 31 people housed in motel rooms**. All members of the family of 9 currently have COVID. Families receive a \$100 Kroger card each week to supplement food stamps. **You can support Family Promise by donations to its Thrift Store (215 W. Watauga Avenue) which provides significant support to the ministry.** Family Promise also can use donations of gently used autos. Church rotations are planned to resume July 11th.

Melting Pot bag lunches, 180 in total, were provided by St. John's on Thursday, April 29th. Each lunch included a sandwich, chips, water, and a snack. **St. John's will again provide lunches for Melting Pot on Thursday, July 29th.**





Every baptized Christian is called to ministry. Sometimes God’s call to us is clear, other times we need help to figure it out.

On Saturday, May 8, the Diocese of East Tennessee will host its second annual *Here I Am* retreat day. This program is intended for anyone who is discerning a call to licensed lay ministry, the vocational diaconate, or the priesthood. It will include remarks by the Bishop, panel discussions with lay and ordained ministers, and opportunities for prayer and fellowship.

All individuals who have begun a process of discernment within their parish are expected to attend along with their sponsoring clergy. Others who are just beginning to explore a call and who would like more information about different ministries and tools for discernment are encouraged to participate.
