

Children's Education

Our children's program serves elementary-age students (kindergarten through sixth grade.) The core of the program is our Sunday school class, held weekly at 9:15 am in the large classroom on the first floor of the church. We follow the Episcopal Children's Curriculum, with frequent use of Godly Play lessons within the sequence of the ECC. Children gather to hear a story from Scripture followed by (and often interspersed with) discussion, singing from the Hymnal, and an art response to the day's lesson. Students leave class with a sticker sporting a question for fellow parishioners to ask them as a way of bringing our fellowship into the wider church community. Please stop to chat when you notice a child's sticker!

This quarter, we are hearing the story of God's people in the desert – learning about the covenant relationships the Lord made with the people who would become the Israelites. Our artwork regularly appears on the bulletin board just to the right of the stairs. Check it out to see amazing examples of young minds at work.

Our class is small but mighty! We are a family and eagerly welcome any children who want to join us, whether for one visit or as regular members of the group.

We currently meet with all three classroom doors open, and masks are required for everyone, to keep our young friends as safe as possible. But these precautions haven't stopped us from enjoying our time together! Please make an effort to have the youngsters in your life join us – we will all be glad you did.

Adult Faith Committee

This group has been meeting monthly since March 2021 to discern our way forward with a theme of “Learning St. John’s Again for the First Time.” This includes learning about each other, about our church, diocese and the Episcopal tradition, and about our neighborhood. The committee consists of Reverend Laura, Rucht Lilavivat representing youth, Fred Mackara representing Adult Faith Forum and Confirmation Class, Lee Phillips representing Education for Ministry, Emily Bidgood representing the Vestry, and Frances Jackson representing Centering Prayer and Conversations and Compline.

Conversations & Compline

Thursday evenings, 6 - 7:15 pm via Zoom

Though not gathering in person, this is a wonderful way of growing in community with each other. We have read and discussed books, watched videos, shared experiences, and learned from each other.

How it works: Each series usually lasts 4 - 6 weeks. While you can “Zoom in” any week without committing to attendance at all sessions, most who participate have found it so interesting and engaging that they do come every week, and we eagerly await for the next series to start.

- ◇ The first hour is “Conversations” followed by 15 minutes of Compline / Evening Prayer.
- ◇ There is no need to sign up or register for Conversations & Compline; just use the Zoom link in St. John’s weekly email. Everyone is welcome to join in however and whenever you can.

Some series use a book or resource that is good to read as we go along or to have on hand; many are available in digital form. For this reason, it can be beneficial to watch for the notice of the upcoming topics and related resources in St. John’s weekly email. Here’s what’s underway and upcoming:

Being Mortal - 6 weeks, Oct 7 - Nov 11

What matters to each of us in light of our faith and the fact of our aging and mortality? Facilitated by Rev. Laura, Dr. David Kalwinsky and Frances Jackson. Resource is Dr. Atul Gawande’s book, *Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End*. December: Advent program - 4 weeks beginning December 2



We will be reading and discussing the Living Compass Advent Booklet, *Practicing Patience with all of your Heart, Soul, Mind, and Strength*. This is a beautiful way to embrace the Advent season, for all parishioners from youth through adult and newcomers as well. There is no fee, and pre-registration is not required.

Hard copies of the booklet are on order (to be available for pickup at the church) or you can receive the booklet in the form of a PDF. Daily readings are also available at livingcompass.org/living-well-through-advent-2021-readings.

Education for Ministry (EfM)

EfM is a four-year course offered by the School of Theology at Sewanee. But don’t be intimidated by the name; it is not a path to ordination, nor is it an academic study in a vacuum. Rather, EfM equips us to explore the intersection of theology and daily living, helping each of us to discern the call to ministry throughout our daily lives. “In coming to terms with the notion that everything we do has potential for manifesting the love of Christ, we discover that our ministry is at hand wherever we turn.” (courtesy: efm.sewanee.org)

Centering Prayer

Tuesday evenings, 6 - 7:00 pm via Zoom

What is Centering Prayer? It is described as “a receptive method of Christian silent prayer which deepens our relationship with God, the Indwelling Presence ... This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship.” (source: www.ContemplativeOutreach.org)

Centering Prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer. Rather, it adds depth of meaning to all prayer and facilitates the movement from more active modes of prayer – verbal, mental or affective prayer – into a receptive prayer of resting in God. (source: www.CenteringPrayer.com)



2021 Annual Parish Meeting & Vestry Elections

Sunday November 14

- ◇ Breakfast at 9 am in the Great Hall
- ◇ Holy Eucharist at 10 am in the Nave, and also via Facebook Live
Note: This is 30 minutes earlier than the usual 10:30 service, and there will be no 8 am service this day.)
- ◇ Annual Parish meeting immediately following worship in the Nave, and also via Zoom

This day also marks the first day of voting for Vestry positions. We will be electing three new Vestry members to replace three whose terms are expiring. (See page 1 sidebar.) Vestry members are elected for 3-year terms.

In alphabetical order, the five nominees for election to the 2022 Vestry are: Tom McGinnis, Rucht Lilavivat, Peter Krause, Anne Koehler, and Hugh Webb. Biographies of each will be sent with the ballots and will also appear in the weekly e-newsletter.

How to vote: Since everyone is not gathering in person, ballots will be mailed to all communicants in good standing. Every household will receive the number of ballots that corresponds to the number of communicants in good standing who live at that address. Each individual should complete his/her own ballot.

You can return all of the household's ballots to the church in person or by mail in the self-addressed, stamped envelope provided. All ballots must be received at the church by noon on Sunday, November 28.

Several factors have combined to produce a positive net income year-to-date through September. In addition to forgiveness of the federal Payroll Protection Plan loan, both pledged income and contributions are ahead of budget thanks to your steadfast financial support. Expenses are lower due to limited use of the church building during

Covid, a corresponding reduction in expenditures for programs and ministries, and fewer facility maintenance expenditures now that our building and roof are in good repair. So yes, we have much to celebrate. And much yet to accomplish. Thank you for your continued support.

A message from the Stewardship Committee

By the time you read this Journal, our celebration of “In-gathering and Commitment Sunday” will have already taken place. Six words come to mind: Thank You! Thank You! Thank You!

Time. Talent. Treasure. These can be represented by a three-legged stool which allows us to determine what's next for St. John's. I like Henri Nouwen's description of stewardship: “...proclaiming what we believe in such a way that we offer other people an opportunity to participate with us in our vision and mission.”



The work of our committee continues well after the in-gathering of pledges to broaden the scope and understanding of stewardship. The Vestry's recent letter named “four points on the horizon for our focus going forward” which also provides the broader construct for stewardship.
